New retirement share classes for certain funds

Wells Fargo Advantage Funds is announcing new retirement share classes for the funds below. These Class R and Class R6 offerings were launched on September 30, 2015, and have an initial trade date of October 1, 2015.

Q. Why were these funds selected for new retirement share classes?

A. The *Wells Fargo Advantage Funds* family offers Class R and Class R6 in a variety of funds. We evaluated our fund offerings for retirement plans and platforms and determined that offering additional share classes for these funds would better serve the needs of our clients.

Q. What are some features of Class R and Class R6?

A. Class R and Class R6 shares are available to many types of retirement plans, including 401(k) plans, 457 plans, profit sharing and money purchase pension plans, defined benefit plans, target benefit plans, and nonqualified deferred compensation plans. Class R and Class R6 shares generally are available only to retirement plans where plan-level or omnibus accounts are held on the books of the fund. They typically are not available to retail accounts.

Class R and Class R6 shares are sold without a front-end sales charge or contingent deferred sales charge.

Class R has a higher net expense ratio than other share classes offered by *Wells Fargo Advantage Funds*. Class R6 has a lower net expense ratio than any other share class and does not offer any payments, such as sub-transfer agent fees, shareholder servicing fees, 12b-1 fees, or revenue share, to retirement plan sponsors or recordkeepers.

Q. Is there a minimum initial investment for Class R or Class R6?

A. No, there is no minimum initial investment for eligible retirement plan investors (as defined in the prospectus) for Class R or Class R6.
